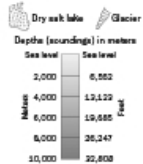
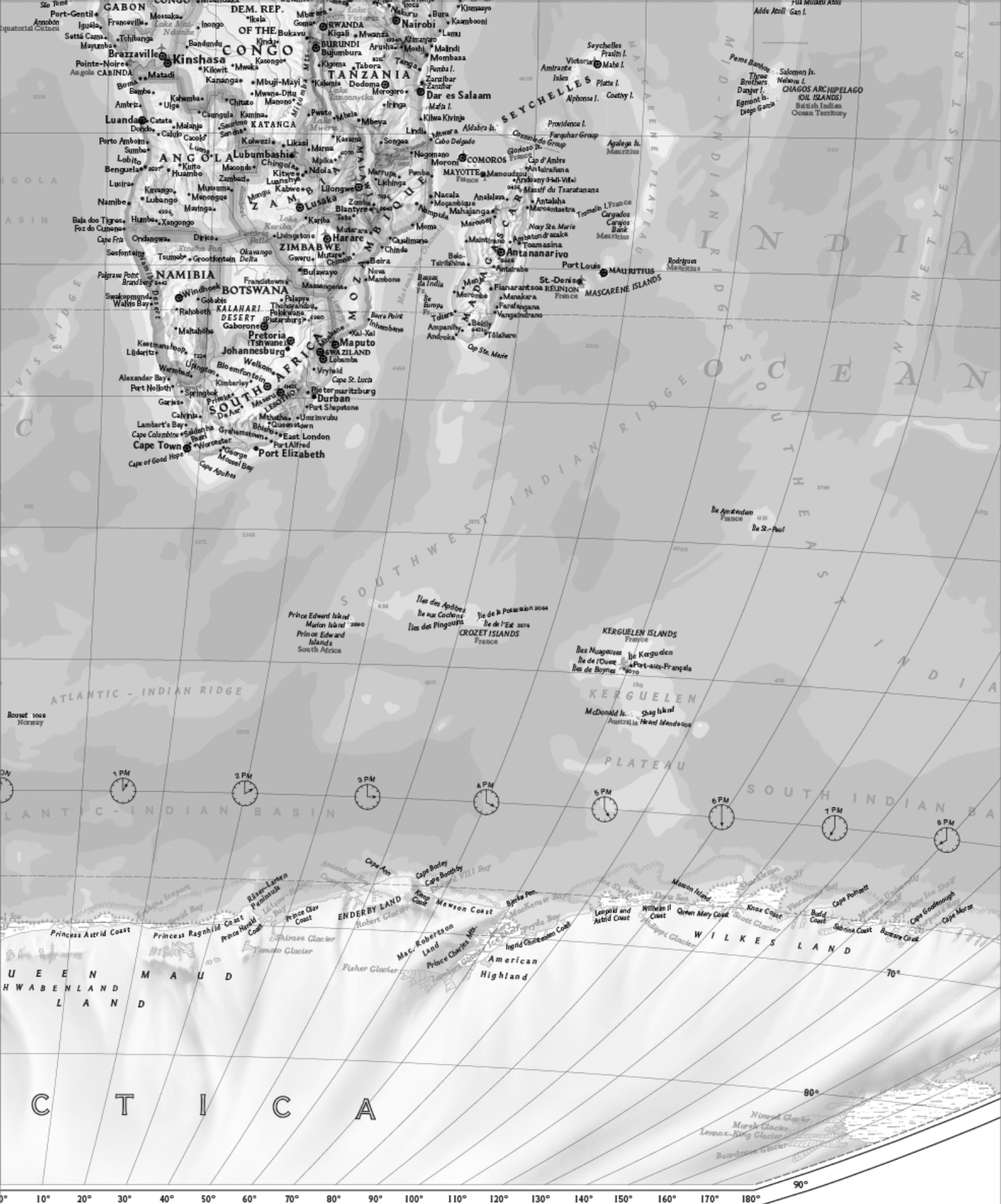


WINKEL TRIPLE PROJECTION, CENTRAL MERIDIAN 0°
